SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of posters with newsmaps and pictures on the back, and a manual, all pertaining to World War II. The newsmaps each have short summaries of the various war fronts for a particular week with accompanying pictures. The following are the titles of the posters and the dates of the newsmaps on the back of the posters. They are arranged in chronological order.
