Description: Working as a Time correspondent in Washington, D.C.; contrast between Harry Truman and Eisenhower's approach to the press; anecdote re: John Foster Dulles and the Indian ambassador; Nelson Rockefeller; summarizing the findings of the Hoover Commission; Eisenhower Administration emphasis on Europe; covering Richard Nixon for Time; Emmett Hughes; assessment of C. D. Jackson; Truman as a decisive President; Joe McCarthy; Chiang Kai-Shek and the China Lobby; Eisenhower's place in history.
